B.2.1 Canoe single and Kayak single events (WK1, WC1, MK1, MC1) – a maximum of one (1) athlete per NOC can participate in each Canoe single and Kayak single event.



B.2.2 Kayak Cross events (MX1 and WX1) – a maximum of two (2) athletes per NOC can participate in each Kayak Cross event.

B.2.3 An athlete qualified and selected for the Olympic Games Paris 2024 may be entered into as many events (specified B.2.) as selected by their NOC, provided that the maximum number of athletes per NOC per event is not exceeded. The athlete must compete in the event that the NOC received their qualification quota.

B.3. Type of allocation of quota places:

The athlete quota place is allocated to the NOC.

C. ATHLETE ELIGIBILITY

C.1. Compliance with the Olympic Charter and other relevant rules

All athletes must respect and comply with the provisions of the Olympic Charter currently in force, including but not limited to Rule 41 (Nationality of Competitors) and Rule 43 (World Anti-Doping Code and the Olympic Movement Code on the Prevention of Manipulation of Competitions).

Only those athletes who respect and comply with the Olympic Charter, the World Anti-Doping Code and the Olympic Movement Code on the Prevention of the Manipulation of Competitions, including the conditions of participation established by the IOC, plus the rules of the ICF, may participate in the Olympic Games Paris 2024.

C.2. Additional IF eligibility criteria

C.2.1. To be eligible to participate in the Olympic Games Paris 2024, all eligible NOCs must participate in at least one (1) Olympic event at the 2023 ICF Canoe Slalom World Championships or the respective continental qualification competition.

C.2.2. To be eligible for a Universality place, an NOC must also be listed on the “ICF Canoe Slalom Ranking” on 31 December 2023.

C.2.3. A minimum of three (3) eligible NOCs must contest each athlete quota place at the Olympic Qualifying Competitions for the event to be valid. If there are less than three (3) NOCs in any Olympic event, then the athlete quota place will be returned for reallocation as outlined in section **F.1. Reallocation of Unused Quota Places**.

D. QUALIFICATION PATHWAY

D.1. ATHLETE QUOTA PLACE DISTRIBUTION

D.1.1 The number of athlete quota places available at the qualification competitions for Canoe Slalom will be as follows:

D.1.2 Distribution of athlete quota through the qualification pathway

D.1.2.1 The initial distribution of athlete quota places through the Global Qualification Competition, the Continental Qualification Competitions and the Host Country places, subject to (i) the limit on maximum athlete quota places as specified in B.2. above and (ii) any eventual reallocation of places in accordance with section **F.1 Reallocation of Unused Quota Places** is defined in the table below:

D.1.3 Rules applicable to all Canoe Slalom Olympic Qualification Competitions

D.1.3.1 An athlete can only obtain one (1) quota place for their NOC. Once this is achieved, they are no longer eligible to be considered for any further athlete quota places even if returned.

D.1.3.2 For Canoe single and Kayak single events, the athlete quota places will be allocated first in the Canoe single events according to the results. Any athlete who has already obtained a quota place in the Canoe single event is not eligible for a quota place in the Kayak single event. The Kayak single quota place will be allocated to the next highest ranked eligible athlete who will obtain a quota place for their NOC.

D.1.3.3 For all Canoe single and Kayak single Qualifying Competitions, where there is a tie between two (2) or more athletes by time, then the results from the previous phases will be used to break the tie, in accordance with ICF Canoe Slalom Competition Rules. The highest placed eligible athlete will obtain for their NOC an athlete quota place.



D.1.4 Canoe and Kayak single Events - Global Qualification Competition

D.1.4.1 The Global Qualification Competition for Canoe single and Kayak single events will be held at the 2023 ICF Canoe Slalom World Championships.

D.1.4.2 The highest placed eligible athletes in each Canoe single and Kayak single event at the 2023 ICF Canoe Slalom World Championships will obtain athlete quota places for their NOC as per the table in D.1.2.

D.1.4.3. In the situation that the Global Qualification Competition for Canoe single and Kayak single events cannot be held nor rescheduled, or the results of the competition are cancelled, then the "ICF Canoe Slalom World Ranking" for the relevant events, as of 31 December 2023, will be used to determine athlete quota places.

D.1.5 Canoe and Kayak single Events - Continental Qualification Competitions

D.1.5.1 If a Continental Qualification Competition takes place before the Global Qualification Competition, the athlete quota places shall be allocated at the same time in the following order: Global Qualification then Continental Qualification event results.

D.1.5.2 The highest placed eligible athlete in each Canoe single and Kayak single event at the respective Continental Qualification Competition will be allocated a quota place for their NOC.

D.1.5.3 Each NOC can earn a maximum of one (1) athlete quota place per gender at the Continental Qualification Competition.

D.1.5.4 In the situation that a Continental Qualification Competition cannot be held and/or the results of such competition are cancelled, then the "ICF Canoe Slalom World Ranking" for the relevant event as of 31 December 2023 will be used to determine the athlete quota places. The highest ranked eligible athlete from that continent in the "ICF Canoe Slalom World Ranking" will obtain one (1) athlete quota place for his/her NOC. If fewer than three (3) NOCs from a continent are included in the "ICF Canoe Slalom World Ranking" of 31 December 2023, who would otherwise be eligible to enter the Continental Qualification Competition, the athlete quota place will be reallocated as outlined in section **F.1 Reallocation of Unused Quota Places**.

D.1.6. Kayak Cross Events - Global Qualification Competition

D.1.6.1 A Kayak Cross Global Qualification Competition will be organised by the ICF in 2024.

D.1.6.2 Only athletes who have not yet qualified an athlete quota place in any event in Canoe single and Kayak single are entitled to enter the Kayak Cross events at the Global Qualification Competition.

D.1.6.3 Each NOC can enter three (3) athletes per gender in the Kayak Cross qualifying events.

D.1.6.4 The highest three (3) ranked eligible NOCs in each Kayak Cross event will be awarded a quota place.



D.2. HOST COUNTRY PLACES

The host country will be allocated one (1) athlete quota place for each gender, provisionally allocated in the Kayak events.

If the host country obtains an athlete quota place in any of the events at one of the qualification competitions including Kayak Cross, the host country quota place for that gender will be reallocated in accordance with **F.2. Reallocation of unused host country places**.

D.3. UNIVERSALITY PLACES

Two (2) Universality places are made available to eligible NOCs at the Olympic Games Paris 2024 in Canoe sport. These places can be attributed to Canoe Sprint and/or Canoe Slalom athletes. Please refer to Canoe Sprint Qualification System for additional information.

On 1 October 2023, the International Olympic Committee (IOC) will invite all eligible NOCs to submit their requests for Universality places. The deadline for NOCs to submit their requests is 15 January 2024. The Tripartite Commission will confirm, in writing, the allocation of Universality places to the relevant NOCs after the end of the qualification period for the sport concerned.

Detailed information on Universality places is contained in the “*Games of the XXXIII Olympiad, Paris 2024 - Olympic Games Universality places - Allocation Procedure and Regulations*” document.

E. CONFIRMATION PROCESS FOR QUOTA PLACES

E.1. CONFIRMATION OF QUOTA PLACES

E.1.1. Within two (2) weeks of the conclusion of the Global Qualification Competition. The ICF will publish and inform the respective NOCs and NFs of their allocated quota places for the completed Continental and Global Qualification Competitions.

E.1.2. Within two (2) weeks of the conclusion of each Continental Qualification Competition, organised after the Global Qualification Competition, the ICF will publish the results on its [website](#) and inform the respective NOCs of their allocated athlete quota places.

E.1.3 The NOC will then have 10 working days to confirm to the ICF:

- That they wish to accept their allocated athlete quota place(s) or decline allocated quota place(s) and return it to the ICF for reallocation to another NOC;
- If a quota place is declined or not accepted within the required time frame, the athlete quota place will be returned for reallocation as outlined in section **F.1 Reallocation of Unused Quota Places**.



E.2. CONFIRMATION OF HOST COUNTRY PLACES

The host country must confirm in writing to the ICF, 10 days after the completion of all qualifying events the use of its host country places.

F. REALLOCATION OF UNUSED QUOTA PLACES

F.1. REALLOCATION OF UNUSED QUOTA PLACES

F.1.1. If an allocated quota place is not confirmed by the NOC by the confirmation of quota place deadline, or is declined by the NOC, the quota place will be reallocated to the next highest-ranked eligible NOC, not yet qualified, at the event at which the quota place was obtained, respecting the maximum quota per gender, per NOC.

F.1.2. Any athlete quota place which is returned or unused due to insufficient entries in a Continental Qualification Competition, will be reallocated in the same event to the next highest ranked eligible NOC, not yet qualified from that continent, in the “ICF Canoe Slalom World Ranking” of 31 December 2023. There must be a minimum of three (3) eligible NOCs from that continent in that event on the ICF world ranking. Should no valid quota place be able to be allocated to that continent then the place will be allocated to the next highest ranked NOC not yet qualified in that event on the “ICF Canoe Slalom World Ranking” regardless of continent. The quota place will be allocated within 10 days of the quota place being returned, or within 10 days of the rankings being published, whichever is later.

F.1.3. If a Kayak Cross quota place is returned then the quota place will be reallocated to the next highest ranked eligible NOC, not yet qualified, from the same event at the Kayak Cross Qualification Competition.

F.1.4. In the event that athlete quota places are not filled from the procedures outlined above, the ICF Executive Committee will allocate the remaining athlete quota places to the next highest ranked eligible NOC not yet qualified in the sport of Canoe at the Olympic Games Paris 2024 using the “ICF Canoe Slalom World Ranking” of 31 December 2023.

F.2. REALLOCATION OF UNUSED HOST COUNTRY PLACES

F.2.1 Where the host country obtains an athlete quota place through the 2023 ICF Canoe Slalom World Championships, the host country place will be reallocated to the next highest ranked eligible NOC, not yet qualified, in the Kayak single event for that gender at the same competition.

F.2.2 Where the host country obtains an athlete quota place through the Continental Qualification competition, the host country place will be reallocated to the next highest ranked eligible NOC, not yet qualified, in the Kayak single event for that gender at the same competition.



F.2.3 Where the host country obtains an athlete quota place through the Kayak Cross global qualification competition, the host country place will be reallocated to the next highest ranked eligible NOC, not yet qualified, in the Kayak single event from the 2023 ICF Canoe Slalom World Championships.

F.3. REALLOCATION OF UNUSED UNIVERSALITY PLACES

If the Tripartite Commission is not able to allocate a Universality place, it will be reallocated using the reallocation procedures outlined in the Canoe Sprint Qualification System section F1.1.

B.3. Type of allocation of quota places:

The athlete quota places in the boat are allocated to the NOC through qualification competitions. The athlete quota places selected for the Olympic Games are not tied to the specific athlete who won the place on behalf of the NOC at the qualification competition.

B.4. Maximum Entries at the Olympic Games in Paris 2024:

B.4.1 An NOC can enter a maximum of two (2) boats per event at the Olympic Games Paris 2024.

B.4.2 The NOC must participate in the event(s) which the NOC had originally obtained the athlete quota place and/or boat quotas. A boat quota can also be allocated to an NOC if an NOC qualifies the boat based on its ranking. In this case, no new athlete quota is assigned as the athlete is already qualified from another event they participated in.

B.4.3 All athletes selected by an NOC must compete in at least one Canoe Sprint event at the Olympic Games Paris 2024.

B.4.4 Athletes must compete in the event(s) that they are entered in by their NOC by the time of Sport Entries Deadline, but can compete in more than one (1) event including the other category (e.g. Canoe and/or Kayak). The maximum number of athletes entered in a category of the relevant gender is set in table B.2.

C. ATHLETE ELIGIBILITY

C.1. Compliance with the Olympic Charter and other relevant rules

All athletes must respect and comply with the provisions of the Olympic Charter currently in force, including but not limited to Rule 41 (Nationality of Competitors) and Rule 43 (World Anti-Doping Code and the Olympic Movement Code on the Prevention of Manipulation of Competitions).

Only those athletes who respect and comply with the Olympic Charter, the World Anti-Doping Code and the Olympic Movement Code on the Prevention of the Manipulation of Competitions, including the conditions of participation established by the IOC, plus the competition rules of the ICF, may participate in the Olympic Games Paris 2024.

C.2. Additional IF Eligibility Criteria

C.2.1. To be eligible to participate in the Olympic Games Paris 2024, all eligible NOCs must participate in at least one (1) Olympic event at the 2023 ICF Canoe Sprint World Championships or the respective continental qualification competition.

C.2.2. To be eligible for a Universality Place the athlete must also have participated in at least one (1) Olympic Qualification Competition for the Olympic Games.



D. QUALIFICATION PATHWAY

D.1. For the purposes of this qualification system, "Olympic Qualification Competition" shall refer to one of the following:

D.1.1. Global Qualification Competition: 2023 ICF Canoe Sprint World Championships

D.1.2. Continental Qualification Competitions:

- a) Europe
- b) Pan-America
- c) Asia
- d) Africa
- e) Oceania

D.2. Distribution of Athlete Quota Places by Event

D.2.1. An athlete may compete in one (1) or more events at an Olympic Qualification Competition.

D.2.2. However, the athlete may obtain only one (1) athlete quota place for their NOC through Olympic Qualification Competitions.

D.2.3. Should any athlete quota place need to be determined other than by the results of direct competitions between athletes in the same race, the distribution of quota places will be to the athlete(s) with the fastest time in the preceding phase of the event.

D.2.4. In case the athlete/boat quota place is determined by direct ranking in finals and more athletes/boats achieve the same time by thousandth of a second (dead heat), the distribution of quota places will be determined through a re-race.

D.2.5. The initial distribution of athlete quota places and boat quota places for Canoe Sprint based on the Olympic Qualification Competition results will be as set out below, subject to:

(i) the limits on maximum athlete quota places and boat quota places as specified in B.2 above; and

(ii) any subsequent reallocation of places in accordance with the provisions of this Qualification System.

D.3. Olympic Qualification Competitions

D.3.1. Global Qualification Competitions: 2023 ICF Canoe Sprint World Championships

D.3.1.1. The initial distribution for the 162 athlete quota places and the initial 74 boat quota places available at the 2023 ICF Canoe Sprint World Championships is set out in the table below, subject to the limits set out in Section B.2. and any subsequent reallocation in accordance with this qualification system.

The athlete quota places available from the Global Qualification Competitions will be allocated as follows:

D.3.1.2. K4 events (Men and Women)

All the athlete quota places for the K4 events will be allocated at the 2023 ICF Canoe Sprint World Championships.

(i) The 10 highest ranked NOCs from the 2023 ICF Canoe Sprint World Championships will each obtain four (4) athlete quota places.

(ii) Where there are fewer than four (4) continents represented in the 10 highest ranked NOCs, then to the extent necessary to ensure that NOCs from four (4) continents obtain athlete quota places, the 10th, ninth (9th) and if necessary, the eighth (8th) ranked place(s) will be reallocated to the next highest ranked NOC



at the 2023 ICF Canoe Sprint World Championships from a continent without any K4 boats qualified in that event.

(iii) Should NOCs from fewer than 4 continents compete in the K4 Finals at the 2023 ICF Canoe Sprint World Championships, then the highest ranked NOC(s) not yet qualified will obtain the athlete quota places regardless of continent.

D.3.1.3. C2 events (Men and Women)

The eight (8) highest ranked NOCs from the 2023 ICF Canoe Sprint World Championships in Men's C2 and Women's C2 events will each obtain two (2) athlete quota places.

D.3.1.4. K2 events (Men and Women)

The six (6) highest ranked unqualified NOCs from the 2023 ICF Canoe Sprint World Championships in Men's K2 and Women's K2 events will each obtain two (2) athlete quota places per gender.

D.3.1.5. K1 events (Men and Women)

The six (6) highest ranked unqualified NOCs from the 2023 ICF Canoe Sprint World Championships in each of the Men's and Women's individual Kayak events will each obtain one (1) athlete quota place.

D.3.1.6. C1 events (Men and Women)

The five (5) highest ranked unqualified NOCs from the 2023 ICF Canoe Sprint World Championships in each of the Men's and Women's individual Canoe events will each obtain one (1) athlete quota place.

D.3.2. Reallocation of places released through "doubling up" in different events

It is a fundamental principle of this qualification system that an athlete may only acquire one (1) athlete quota place for their NOC regardless of how many events the athlete competes in during the qualification process. Once an athlete obtains an athlete quota place they are not eligible to compete in any further Olympic Qualification Competitions. In each case an NOC qualifies in an event, a boat quota will be allocated regardless of the allocation (or reallocation) of the athlete quota place(s).

D.3.2.1. On completion of the 2023 ICF Canoe Sprint World Championships all remaining athlete quota places which have been released as a result of athletes "doubling up", that is they qualify for more than one athlete quota place in a different boat class, will be redistributed in the following manner:

D.3.2.2. If an athlete qualifies for more than one (1) athlete quota place in different boat classes (i.e. K1, K2, K4 or C1 and C2) at the 2023 ICF Canoe Sprint World Championships the athlete's NOC will be allocated only one (1) athlete quota place. This shall be an athlete quota place in the event with the largest boat class out of the events in which the athlete qualified. The released athlete quota place(s) will be allocated to the next best ranked NOC not yet qualified in the next smaller boat class (i.e. from K4 to K2 or from C2 to C1) of the relevant event.

D.3.2.3. Any quota places released in the K2 or C2 boats will be grouped together and will be reallocated to the highest ranked NOCs not yet qualified in the relevant K2 or C2 event at the 2023 ICF Canoe Sprint World Championships, to enable those NOCs to fill the K2 or C2 boats.

D.3.2.4. Should there be any sole athlete quota place remaining after the reallocation to K2 and C2 events, then the quota place will be allocated to the next highest ranked NOC not yet qualified in the K1 or C1 event in the respective gender at the 2023 ICF Canoe Sprint World Championships.



D.3.2.5. Any quota places released in the K1 or C1 boats will be reallocated to the highest ranked NOCs not yet qualified in the relevant K1 or C1 event at the 2023 ICF Canoe Sprint World Championships.

D.3.2.6. In the situation that the Global Qualification Competitions cannot be held, then the results of the 2022 ICF Canoe Sprint World Championships for the relevant event will be used to determine the athlete quota places. The highest ranked NOC not yet qualified in each event receives the athlete quota places.

D.3.3. Continental Qualification Competitions

D.3.3.1. Only an NOC that has not obtained an athlete quota place in an event (e.g. boat or athlete quota places) at the Global Qualification Competitions can participate in the respective Continental Qualification to compete for an athlete quota place in that event.

D.3.3.2. Only athletes that have not obtained athlete quota places at the Global Qualification Competitions are eligible to compete in the Continental Qualification Competitions.

D.3.3.3. A minimum of three (3) NOCs must contest each athlete quota place at the Continental Qualification for the event to be eligible. If there are not three (3) or more NOCs in an event, then the athlete quota place(s) will be reallocated to the next highest ranked NOC, in that event, not yet qualified at the 2023 ICF Canoe Sprint World Championships, irrespective of the continent.

D.3.3.4. The initial distribution of athlete quota places available at the Continental Qualification Competitions will be as set out in the table below, subject to:

- (i) the limits on maximum athlete quota places and boat quota places as specified in B.2. above; and
- (ii) any subsequent reallocation of places in accordance with the provisions of this qualification system;

D.3.3.5. K1 events and C1 events (Men and Women)

Europe, Pan-America and Asia continents will be given two (2) athlete quota places for single boats to be won at each Continental Qualification Competition. For the African and Oceanian Continents they will be given one (1) quota place for single boats to be obtained at each Continental Qualification Competition.

D.3.3.6. K2 events and C2 events (Men and Women)

Each continent will be given two (2) athlete quota places for double boats to be won at each Continental Qualification Competition.

D.3.3.7. Reallocation of places released through “doubling ups” in different events

If an athlete qualifies for more than one (1) athlete quota place in different boat classes (i.e. K1 and K2 or C1 and C2) at the Continental Qualification Competitions, the athlete's NOC will be allocated only one (1) athlete quota place. This shall be an athlete quota place in the event with the larger boat class out of the events in which the athlete qualified. The released athlete quota place will be allocated to the next best ranked NOC not yet qualified in the smaller boat class (i.e. from C2 to C1) of the relevant event.

D.3.3.8. Maximum Quota places at Continental Qualification Competitions

An NOC can qualify a maximum of two (2) athlete quota places in each category, that is, Kayak men, Kayak women, Canoe men and Canoe women at the Continental Qualification Competitions. The unused athlete quota places will be allocated to the next highest ranked NOC not yet qualified in the K1 or C1 event of that gender.

D.3.3.9. In the situation that a Continental Qualification Competition cannot be held, then the results of the 2023 ICF Canoe Sprint World Championships for the relevant event will be used to determine the athlete quota places for that continent. Athlete quota places will be allocated to the respective continent, for which the Continental Qualification Competition could not be held in accordance with D.3.3.

D.4. HOST COUNTRY PLACES

The host country will be provisionally allocated quota places in the following events:

- Men's Kayak Single (K1) 1000m
- Men's Canoe Single (C1) 1000m
- Women's Kayak Single (K1) 500m
- Women's Canoe Single (C1) 200m

The host country must compete in the respective category (i.e. Men's Kayak, Women's Kayak, Men's Canoe and Women's Canoe) at the ICF Canoe Sprint Global Olympic Qualification Competition to be eligible, plus they must comply with the requirements outlined in section C. Athlete Eligibility of this document.

D.5. UNIVERSALITY PLACES

Two (2) Universality Places in single boats are made available to eligible NOCs at the Olympic Games Paris 2024 in the sport of Canoe. These places can be attributed to Canoe Sprint or Canoe Slalom athletes.



To be eligible for a Universality Place the athlete must have participated in at least one (1) Olympic qualification event.

On 1 October 2023, the International Olympic Committee (IOC) will invite all eligible NOCs to submit their requests for Universality places. The deadline for NOCs to submit their requests is 15 January 2024. The Tripartite Commission will confirm, in writing, the allocation of Universality Places to the relevant NOCs after the end of the qualification period for the sport concerned.

Detailed information on Universality Places is contained in the “Games of the XXXIII Olympiad, Paris 2024 - Olympic Games Universality Places - Allocation Procedure and Regulations” document.

E. CONFIRMATION PROCESS FOR QUOTA PLACES

E.1 CONFIRMATION OF QUOTA PLACES

Within 10 working days following each qualification competition, the ICF will publish the results on its [website](#) and inform the respective NOCs/NFs of their allocated athlete quota places. The NOCs will then have up to 10 working days from that notification to confirm to the ICF:

- a) That they wish to accept their allocated athlete quota places or to return them to the ICF for reallocation to another NOC;
- b) Where they need to return provisionally allocated athlete quota places in accordance to B.2 above; or
- c) If a quota place is not accepted within the required time frame, the athlete quota place will be returned for reallocation as outlined in section **F.1 Reallocation of Unused Quota Places**.

E.2 CONFIRMATION OF HOST COUNTRY PLACES

The host country must confirm in writing to the ICF 10 working days after the last qualification competition the use of its host country places.

F. REALLOCATION OF UNUSED QUOTA PLACES

F.1 REALLOCATION OF UNUSED QUOTA PLACES

F.1.1. Global Qualification Competitions

If an allocated quota place is not confirmed by the NOC by the confirmation of quota place deadline or is declined by the NOC, the quota place will be reallocated to the next highest ranked eligible NOC, not yet qualified, at the Qualification competition at which the quota place was obtained, respecting the maximum quota per gender and per NOC. This process will be repeated until all places are allocated.



F.1.2. Continental Qualification Competitions

F.1.2.1. If an allocated athlete quota place from the Continental Qualification Competitions is not confirmed by the NOC by the confirmation of quota place deadline or is declined/returned by the NOC then the quota place will be reallocated to the next highest ranked NOC in that event, not yet qualified. This process will be repeated until all places are allocated.

F.1.2.2. In the case where there are no more eligible NOCs that can obtain an athlete quota place from the Continental Qualification Competitions, the next highest ranked NOC from that continent in the same event at the 2023 ICF Canoe Sprint World Championships, not yet qualified, will be allocated the athlete quota place.

F.1.2.3. In the case that no further NOCs from the same continent can obtain a place from the 2023 ICF Canoe Sprint World Championships in that event, the athlete quota place will be allocated to the next highest ranked NOC from the 2023 ICF Canoe Sprint World Championships, not yet qualified, regardless of continental representation.

F.1.2.4. If an athlete quota place is not filled from the procedures outlined above, the ICF Executive Committee would then reallocate the remaining quota place to the next highest ranked NOC, not yet qualified in the sport of Canoe based on the results of the ICF Canoe Sprint Olympic Qualification Competitions across all Olympic events.

F.2 REALLOCATION OF UNUSED HOST COUNTRY PLACES

Where the host country obtains an athlete quota place in any category, the unused host country place will be reallocated to the next highest placed NOC, not yet qualified, in that event respectively from the 2023 ICF Canoe Sprint World Championships.

F.3 REALLOCATION OF UNUSED UNIVERSALITY PLACES

Any unused Universality place(s) will be reallocated to the next highest ranked eligible NOC from the 2023 ICF Canoe Sprint World Championships that has not yet qualified any athlete quota in the sport of Canoe (Canoe Sprint, Canoe Slalom).
