**Age Requirements:**

- Hold a valid license issued by a National Federation recognised by the UCI.
- Have at least 10 UCI points in the UCI BMX Freestyle Park Elite Individual ranking of 12 May 2020.

### HOST COUNTRY PLACES

The Host Country is guaranteed one (1) quota place per gender in case it did not qualify any qualification places. If the Host Country qualified qualification places, the Host Country place(s) will be reallocated as detailed in paragraph **F. Reallocation of Unused Host Country Places**.

### TRIPARTITE COMMISSION INVITATION PLACES

In BMX Freestyle, no Tripartite Commission Invitation Places will be directly allocated as part of the athletes' quota. Tripartite Commission Places may be offered to NOCs within the reallocation process for unused qualification places in individual events, once the initial quota allocation has been completed as described in paragraph **F. Reallocation of Unused Qualification Places**.

On 14 October 2019, the International Olympic Committee will invite all eligible NOCs to submit their requests for Tripartite Commission Invitation Places. The deadline for NOCs to submit their requests is 15 January 2020. The Tripartite Commission will confirm, in writing, the allocation of invitation places to the relevant NOCs after the end of the qualification period for the concerned sport.

Detailed information on Tripartite Invitation places is contained in the "*Games of the XXXII Olympiad, 2020 Tokyo - Olympic Games Tripartite Commission Invitation Places - Allocation Procedure and Regulations*".

### E. CONFIRMATION PROCESS FOR QUOTA PLACES

Should any quota places remain unallocated after application of the allocation process as described in paragraph **D. Qualification Pathway**, they will be allocated - with a maximum of one (1) quota place per NOC - to the next highest ranked NOC in the UCI Olympic Qualification ranking, which has not yet obtained a quota place.

On 12 May 2020, the final UCI Olympic Qualification ranking and the UCI BMX Freestyle Park Elite Individual ranking will be published on the UCI website ([www.uci.org](http://www.uci.org)), and by 19 May 2020 the UCI will inform the respective NOCs of their allocated quota places. The NOCs will then have 14 days to confirm if they wish to use these quota places, as detailed in paragraph **H. Qualification Timeline**.



## F. REALLOCATION OF UNUSED QUOTA PLACES

### REALLOCATION OF UNUSED QUALIFICATION PLACES

If a quota place allocated is not confirmed by the NOC by the confirmation of quota place deadline, or is declined by the NOC, the quota place will be reallocated to the next highest ranked NOC in the UCI Olympic Qualification ranking of 12 May 2020, which has not yet obtained a quota place.

If a quota place remains unallocated, all such quota places will be reallocated by the Tripartite Commission as a Tripartite Commission Invitation Place.

### REALLOCATION OF UNUSED HOST COUNTRY PLACES

Should the Host Country qualify qualification places or decide not to use the allocated Host Country places, the latter will be reallocated to the next highest ranked NOC in the UCI Olympic Qualification ranking of 12 May 2020, which has not yet obtained a quota place.

## G. GENERAL PRINCIPLES REGARDING THE USE OF RESERVE ATHLETES

### RESERVE ATHLETES

Competing athletes, who have an Aa accreditation and who are entered by their NOC in any cycling event, may be selected to replace another entered athlete in a different cycling discipline/event until the time of the final confirmation for that event.

Reserve athletes must comply with the same eligibility rules as competing athletes as described in paragraph **C. Athlete eligibility**.

#### P ALTERNATE ATHLETES

P alternate athletes are non-competing athletes, and are not included within the athlete's quota as described in Paragraph **B. Athletes Quota**. More detailed information about entitlements and quotas can be found in the '*Accreditation at the Olympic Games – Users Guide*'. P alternate athletes can only become competing athletes as per the conditions outlined in the '*IOC/Tokyo 2020 Late Athlete Replacement policy*'. Such replacement can be done at latest until 1 hour before the competition begins.

### E. CONFIRMATION PROCESS FOR QUOTA PLACES

#### Final allocation of quota places

Any quota places which would have not been allocated at the end of paragraph **D. Qualification Pathway**, will be allocated in the order of the UCI World Ranking by nations:

1. In priority, to NOCs whose quota has been reduced due to the allocation of quota places based on the Individual UCI World Ranking.
2. Then, to NOCs which did not qualify any quota.

#### Confirmation

By 15 November 2019, the UCI will inform the respective NOCs/national federations of their allocated quota places. The NOCs will then have until 15 December 2019 to confirm to the UCI if they wish to use these quota places, as detailed in paragraph **H. Qualification Timeline**.

N.B. For each gender, in order to make use of the right to enter athletes for the Individual Time Trial, NOCs must confirm a corresponding number of quotas for the Road Race. The total number of entries confirmed for the Individual Time Trial may not exceed the total number of confirmed quota places for the Road Race.

### F. REALLOCATION OF UNUSED QUOTA PLACES

If a quota place allocated is not confirmed by the NOC by the confirmation of quota place deadline or is declined by the NOC, the quota place will be reallocated as follows:

1. In priority, to the highest ranked NOC qualified through the UCI World Ranking by nations of 22 October 2019 whose quota was reduced due to the allocation of quota places based on the Individual UCI World Ranking.
2. Then, to an NOC that has not qualified a quota place for the Road Race event and had an athlete ranked among the top 10 in the Elite Individual Time Trial event of the 2019 UCI Road World Championships; with priority given to the NOC with the highest ranked athlete.
3. Finally, to the highest ranked NOC in the UCI World Ranking by nations of 22 October 2019 not yet qualified.

Maximum one (1) quota place can be allocated to an NOC through the above reallocation process.

The quota place obtained through the above reallocation process shall give right to enter one (1) athlete in the Road Race only, without prejudice to the reallocation system for the Individual Time Trial described below.

In the case an entry in the Individual Time Trial event is declined by the NOC, the entry will be reallocated as follows:

1. In priority, to the highest ranked NOC in the UCI World Ranking by nations of 22 October 2019 that had qualified a quota place for the Road Race event but did not yet get an entry to the Individual Time Trial.
2. Then, to the next highest ranked NOC in the results of the Elite Individual Time Trial event of the 2019 UCI Road World Championships, that had qualified a quota place for the Road Race event but that had not yet received an entry to the Individual Time Trial event.

### G. GENERAL PRINCIPLES REGARDING THE USE OF RESERVE ATHLETES

#### RESERVE ATHLETES

Competing athletes, who have an Aa accreditation and who are entered by their NOC in any cycling event, may be selected to replace another entered athlete in a different cycling discipline/event until the time of the final confirmation for that event.

Reserve athletes must comply with the same eligibility rules as competing athletes as described in paragraph **C. Athlete eligibility**.

## C. ATHLETE ELIGIBILITY

All athletes must comply with the provisions of the Olympic Charter currently in force, including but not limited to, Rule 41 (Nationality of Competitors) and Rule 43 (World Anti-Doping Code and the Olympic Movement Code on the Prevention of Manipulation of Competitions). Only those athletes who comply with the Olympic Charter may participate in the Olympic Games Tokyo 2020.

### Age Requirements:

All athletes participating in the Olympic Games Tokyo 2020 must be born on or before 31 December 2002.

### Additional IF Eligibility Criteria:

To be eligible to participate in the Olympic Games Tokyo 2020, all athletes must:

- Hold a valid license issued by a National Federation recognised by the UCI.
- Have at least 10 UCI points in an Olympic qualifying event.

## D. QUALIFICATION PATHWAY

### QUALIFICATION PLACES

The UCI Olympic Track Ranking 2018-2020 will be used to allocate the 189 athletes quota places.

A specific UCI Olympic Track Ranking 2018-2020 is established for each of the Events of Track Cycling, as per the UCI Regulations. Reference to the UCI Olympic Track Ranking 2018-2020 under section Qualification Events below shall refer to the event specific ranking.

Each UCI Olympic Track Ranking 2018-2020 includes results by nation of the last two editions of each Elite Continental Championships; best three UCI Track Cycling World Cup results by nation of each season 2018-2019 and 2019-2020 (with at least one result outside of the NOC's continent per season); and the results by nation of the 2019 and 2020 UCI Elite Track Cycling World Championships.

2. In each gender, in the event a Continent is not represented in any endurance type event (*i.e.* Team Pursuit, Madison or Omnium), the highest ranked NOC on the UCI Olympic Track Ranking 2018-2020 for Omnium of that Continent shall be entitled to one (1) quota place in the Omnium event. Any such allocation will result in a corresponding reduction of places allocated to NOCs through the UCI Olympic Track Ranking 2018-2020 for Omnium, in the reverse order of the latter.

### **HOST COUNTRY PLACES**

No Host Country places are available in Track Cycling for the Olympic Games Tokyo 2020.

### **TRIPARTITE COMMISSION INVITATION PLACES**

In Track Cycling, no Tripartite Commission Invitation Places will be directly allocated as part of the athletes' quota. Tripartite Commission Places may be offered to NOCs within the reallocation process for unused qualification places in individual events, once the initial quota allocation has been completed as described in paragraph **F. Reallocation of Unused Qualification Places**.

On 14 October 2019, the International Olympic Committee will invite all eligible NOCs to submit their requests for Tripartite Commission Invitation Places. The deadline for NOCs to submit their requests is 15 January 2020. The Tripartite Commission will confirm, in writing, the allocation of invitation places to the relevant NOCs after the end of the qualification period for the concerned sport.

Detailed information on Tripartite Invitation places is contained in the "*Games of the XXXII Olympiad, 2020 Tokyo - Olympic Games Tripartite Commission Invitation Places - Allocation Procedure and Regulations*".

### **E. CONFIRMATION PROCESS FOR QUOTA PLACES**

Following each qualification event, the UCI will publish the results on its website [www.uci.org/track/rankings](http://www.uci.org/track/rankings) and update the corresponding UCI Olympic Track Ranking. On 2 March 2020, the final UCI Olympic Track Ranking will be published on the UCI website and by 9 March 2020, the UCI will inform the respective NOCs of their allocated quota places.

The NOCs will then have 14 days to confirm if they wish to use these quota places, as detailed in paragraph **H. Qualification Timeline**.

### F. REALLOCATION OF UNUSED QUOTA PLACES

#### REALLOCATION OF UNUSED QUALIFICATION PLACES

If an allocated quota place in an individual event is not confirmed by the NOC by the confirmation of quota place deadline, or is declined by the NOC, the quota place will be reallocated by the Tripartite Commission as a Tripartite Commission Invitation Place.

If the Tripartite Commission is not able to allocate the unused qualification place, the quota place will be reallocated, in the same event, to the next highest ranked NOC on the UCI Olympic Track Ranking, respecting the maximum quota of athletes per NOC per event and the special provisions 1 and 2 of paragraph **D. Qualification Pathway** pertaining to continental representation.

If an allocated quota place in a team event is not confirmed by the NOC by the confirmation of quota place deadline or is declined by the NOC, the quota place will be reallocated in the same event to the next highest ranked NOC on the UCI Olympic Track Ranking not yet qualified in the relevant event.

In case no NOC is eligible for reallocation according to the above process, the quota place will be reallocated, in the same event, to the next highest ranked NOC on the final 2019-2020 UCI Track Classification, respecting the maximum quota of athletes per NOC per event.

### G. GENERAL PRINCIPLES REGARDING THE USE OF RESERVE AND P ALTERNATE ATHLETES

#### RESERVE ATHLETES

Competing athletes, who have an Aa accreditation and who are entered by their NOC in any cycling event, may be selected to replace another entered athlete in a different cycling discipline/event until the time of the final confirmation for that event.

Reserve athletes must comply with the same eligibility rules as competing athletes as described in paragraph **C. Athlete eligibility**.

#### P ALTERNATE ATHLETES\*

P alternate athletes are non-competing athletes, and are not included within the athlete's quota as described in paragraph **B. Athletes Quota**. More detailed information about entitlements and quotas can be found in the '*Accreditation at the Olympic Games – Users Guide*'. P alternate athletes can only become competing athletes as per the conditions outlined in the '*IOC/Tokyo 2020 Late Athlete Replacement policy*'.

##### Eligibility:

P alternate athletes must comply with the same eligibility rules as competing athletes as described in above paragraph **C. Athlete Eligibility**.

##### Quota:

Each qualified team in Team Sprint is entitled to one (1) P alternate athlete.

Each NOC with a team qualified in Team Pursuit and/or Madison is entitled to one (1) P alternate athlete.

The final deadline for the substitution of an athlete by a P alternate athlete is at the time of the confirmation of the composition of the teams, in accordance with the UCI regulations ([www.uci.org](http://www.uci.org) , Articles 3.2.079 and 3.2.149).

If a quota place allocated through the UCI Olympic Qualification ranking is not confirmed by the NOC by the confirmation of quota place deadline, or is declined by the NOC, the quota place will be reallocated to the next highest ranked NOC in the UCI Olympic Qualification ranking of 28 May 2020, which has not yet obtained a quota place.

If a quota place allocated through the Elite Individual results from the 2019 Continental Championships is not confirmed by the NOC, or is declined by the NOC, the quota place will be reallocated to the next highest ranked NOC from the respective continent in the Elite Individual results of the 2019 Continental Championships, which has not yet obtained a quota place. If no NOC is eligible, the quota place will then be allocated to the next highest ranked NOC on the UCI Olympic Qualification ranking of 28 May 2020, which has not yet obtained a quota place.

If a quota place allocated through the Elite or U23 Individual results from the 2019 World Championships is not confirmed by the NOC, or is declined by the NOC, the quota place will be reallocated to the next highest ranked NOC in the respective Elite or U23 Individual results of the 2019 World Championships, which has not yet obtained a quota place. If no NOC is eligible, the quota place will then be allocated to the next highest ranked NOC on the UCI Olympic Qualification ranking of 28 May 2020, which has not yet obtained a quota place.

If a quota place remains unallocated, all such quota places will be reallocated by the Tripartite Commission as a Tripartite Commission Invitation Place.



## QUALIFICATION SYSTEM – GAMES OF THE XXXII OLYMPIAD – TOKYO 2020

### REALLOCATION OF UNUSED HOST COUNTRY PLACES

Should the Host Country qualify qualification places or decide not to use the allocated Host Country places, the latter will be reallocated to the next highest ranked NOC in the UCI Olympic Qualification ranking of 28 May 2020, which has not yet obtained a quota place.

### G. GENERAL PRINCIPLES REGARDING THE USE OF RESERVE ATHLETES

#### RESERVE ATHLETES

Competing athletes, who have an Aa accreditation and who are entered by their NOC in any cycling event, may be selected to replace another entered athlete in a different cycling discipline/event until the time of the final confirmation for that event.

Reserve athletes must comply with the same eligibility rules as competing athletes as described in paragraph C. **Athlete eligibility.**
