* According to the Buenos Aires 2018 Qualification Systems Principles, participation in team sports shall be limited to one woman's and one men's team per NOC across team sports (Football, Handball, Hockey, and Rugby) with the exception of the host country who can enter one team in Football, Handball, Hockey and Rugby.

3. Type of Allocation of Quota Places:

The quota place is allocated to the NOC.

C. ATHLETE ELIGIBILITY

All athletes must comply with the provisions of the Olympic Charter currently in force, including but not limited to, Rule 41 (Nationality of Competitors). Only those athletes who have complied with the Olympic Charter may participate in the Youth Olympic Games.

To be eligible to participate in the Youth Olympic Games, athletes must have been born between 1 January 2000 and 31 December 2002.

D.1 11 men teams 11 women teams	<p>D.1 Under-17 Beach Handball World Championships (U17 BHWch)</p> <p>U17 BH World Championships will include the top four (4) European teams, the top four (4) Pan-America teams, the top three (3) Asian teams, the top two (2) African teams and the top two (2) Oceania teams from the respective Continental Qualification Events will qualify for the U17 BHWch.</p> <p>The host country of the U17 BHWch will automatically be eligible to enter the U17 BHWch.</p> <p>Eleven (11) quota places will be allocated at the U17 BHWch to the top ranked teams of the respective continents according to the distribution below:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 1 Africa • 2 Asia • 3 Europe • 2 Pan America • 1 Oceania <p>Argentina, as the Host NOC of the YOG, can participate in the U17 BHWCh, however its result will only be valid as a final result of the U17 BHWCh.</p> <p>The remaining two (2) quota places will be allocated to the next best ranked teams at the U17 BHWCh, irrespective of the continent.</p>

HOST COUNTRY PLACES

The host country will automatically qualify one (1) men's and one (1) women's team on the condition that athletes meet the eligibility requirements described under point C of this document.

E. CONFIRMATION PROCESS FOR QUOTA PLACES

CONFIRMATION OF QUALIFICATION PLACES

On 31 July 2017, the IHF will inform the respective NOCs of their allocated quota places. The NOCs will then have until 6 August 2018 to confirm in writing to the IHF and BAYOGOC if they wish to use these quota places as detailed in Section G. Qualification Timeline.

CONFIRMATION OF HOST COUNTRY PLACES

The host country must confirm in writing to the IHF and BAYOGOC by 1 June 2017 the use of its Host Country Places.

F. REALLOCATION OF UNUSED QUOTA PLACES

REALLOCATION OF UNUSED QUALIFICATION PLACES

If a quota place allocated is not confirmed by the NOC by the confirmation of quota place deadline or is declined by the NOC, the quota place will be reallocated to the next best-ranked NOC from the respective continent not yet qualified from the U17 BHWCh.

If the quota place is still available, it will be reallocated to the best-ranked NOC from the respective continent not yet qualified in the IHF Beach Handball Senior Ranking, of 20 July 2017.

If the quota place is still available, it will be reallocated to the best-ranked NOC not yet qualified in the IHF Beach Handball Senior Ranking, of 20 July 2017.

REALLOCATION OF UNUSED HOST COUNTRY PLACES

Any unused Host Country Place (returned or achieved through the U17 BHWCh) will be reallocated to the next best-ranked NOC not yet qualified from the Pan American continent at the U17 BHWCh.

If the quota place is still available, it will be reallocated to the best-ranked NOC from Pan America not yet qualified in the IHF Beach Handball Senior Ranking, of 20 July 2017.
